As First Vice Commander and Marketing Chair of a very productive team, I'm reporting an extraordinary two months. In early January, we staffed a tent at the annual Cape Coral Arts Festival, one of the largest juried art festivals in Lee County. Later in the month, we called the 100 prospects we gathered information from and then held an Open House to invite those prospects to join the Legion. In February, we staffed a tent at the Cape Coral Charity Classic Car Show, and although the Car Show doesn't attract the number of visitors as the Arts Fest, it was a good PR event. We also plan to recruit at the Car Show for Veterans, scheduled at the German American Club grounds on March 22nd. The productivity of the marketing and membership team is apparent, as demonstrated by the Post's achievement of 92% of its goal, already exceeding its membership goal of 90% for March 5th. We are confident the Post will reach its goal of 100% by May 7.

Regarding publicity, the marketing team, most notably Bill McKernan, submitted five newspaper articles covering Post, Auxiliary, and Rider events in the last two months.

On another positive note, Post 90's Oratorical Scholarship candidate Kris Wydysh won the Post, District, and Area scholarship competitions and will now compete at the Department level on March 15 in Orlando.

Cape Coral student wins at American Legion Area Scholarship Competition.

The American Legion Post 90 candidate, Kris Wydysh, won 1st place at the Legion's Area Oratorical Scholarship competition held at the Port Charlotte Legion Post in Orlando, Florida, on Sunday, February 8th, 2025, after winning the competition at the Post and District levels. He now moves on to the State competition to be held in Orlando on March 15th.

To compete, Kris prepared and delivered an original 8 to 10-minute speech about voting rights based on the Constitution. He emphasized citizens' duty to their country and the responsibility to adhere to that right. Additionally, Kris gave a 3 –5-minute speech on an assigned topic to test his knowledge of one of four other Constitutional amendments.

In January 2025, the local Post Acting Commander, Ted Clark, awarded Kris, the first-place winner, a \$600 scholarship. The district and area scholarships followed by awarding \$300 each to Kris. At the state level, the potential awards are \$500-\$2500 for the top six contestants.

Ted Clark, also the Post 90 Oratorical Chair, stated, "he was thrilled and proud to see Kris excel at each level of the scholarship competition and hopes other Cape Coral students will be attracted to the Legion competition."

POST 90 MARKETING CORNER



I'm delighted to report on the successful outcome the Marketing Committee experienced at Cape Coral's 2025 Arts Festival. The festival is the most significant cultural event the City of Cape Coral offers, coordinated by the Cape Coral Rotary Club, held on Saturday and Sunday, 1/11 and 1/12.

We spoke to approximately 1000 festival attendees (a 40% increase) and distributed 175 Legionnaire, Aux, and Son's applications (a 100% increase) and 200 business cards (a 95% increase). Most importantly, we collected contact information on 99 legionnaire prospects (a 37% increase), including 21 female vets, 11 SAL, 14 Aux, and three transfers. The difficult work of following up on these prospective leads has begun.

The publicity our Post and our programs gain from being exposed to thousands of festival attendees, and passers-by is challenging to measure, but it is effective in enhancing our image and promoting our Post.

Although the number of festival attendees at Art Fest easily exceeded the Oktoberfest attendees, we were concerned that the number of qualified prospects would be less significant or approximately the same in number as the Oktoberfest. We expected this for three reasons:

- We staffed the booth for two days at the Arts Fest, while the Oktoberfest needed more hours, 12-10 pm, for four days and two nights versus 10-5 for two days at the Arts Fest.
- The wide geographic distribution of the Arts Fest attendees was a challenge. The Arts Festival is very popular with attendees from all over Lee County, making fewer attendees eligible for our Legion Cape Coral membership; however, it often needed the same amount of time to interview prospects.
- At the time when attendees passing the booth were most frequent, we needed more staff to interview all the potential candidates. The SAL could not participate, the Auxiliary members were limited to two, and one Marketing Committee member was unavailable. Next year, we will recruit more volunteers and work in shifts, as we did for the Oktoberfest.

I thank all the members for setting up and staffing the tent, especially John Leuthard. On Saturday, Bill McKernan, Harry Finke, Lisa Arnold, Michelle, Tammy, Chuck, and I had an extraordinarily successful day staffing the tent despite the rain and wind. On Sunday, Darly and Rebecca joined Bill, Harry, Lisa, and me in staffing the tent. We again determined that the most successful strategy was to have Rebecca out in the crowd, sending potential prospects to our table.

We registered for and set up our tent at the Cape Coral Charity Car Show, hosted at Mariner HS on February 22nd. The show featured a tribute to the military at noon. The CC Car Show is the largest classic car show in Lee County.

Hello everyone,

The American Legion Post 90 had a successful PR event at Cape Coral’s Charity Car Show at Mariners HS on Saturday, 02/22/25, from 9 am to 3 pm. The American Legion Marketing Committee members conversed with almost 70 show attendees and distributed 15 applications, approximately 40 business cards, and 20 coloring books, comic books, and crayons to children and Marines. Most importantly, we collected contact information from 5 prospects. The publicity obtained for our Post and our programs from being exposed to 7 thousands classic car enthusiasts is challenging to measure but effective in enhancing the Legion and our Post’s image.

The Charity Car Show, held at Mariner HS, is sponsored by Cape Coral First Methodist Church, with proceeds benefiting Cape Coral Caring Center. In 2024, the Show raised \$70,000 for the Caring Center. At this year’s Show, there were at least 500 cars and seven thousand spectators. At noon, a tribute to the US military and first responders featuring the Star-Spangled Banner was performed along with each military branch’s anthem. Bill’s neighbor, Pete, placed American Legion Decals on each side of his classic car and parked it in a conspicuous place, as did our Post Historian, Joe Lindhurst, with his classic car.

I want to thank the Marketing Committee of Harry Finke, Bill McKernan, Joe Lindhurst, member Kurt Hartman, and Bill’s neighbor Pete for their time and effort in ensuring another successful Post 90 PR event.

On Sunday, February 2nd, 2025, at 1pm, a Four Chaplain's Ceremony was held at American Legion Post 90. This event celebrates the bravery and sacrifice of four Army Chaplains. On the evening of February 2nd, 1943, they gave their lives on the troop transport USAT Dorchester carrying 902 American servicemenn, merchant seamen, and civilian workers to England (672 died and 230 survived). The Dorchester was 150 miles from its destination when it was struck by one of three torpedoes launched from the German submarine U-223. Aboard the Dorchester were four Chaplains, Lt. George Fox (Methodist), Lt. alexander Goode (Jewish), Lt. John Washington (Roman Catholic), and Lt, Clkark Poling (Dutch Reformed). The surviving men saw the four Chaplains with linked arms offering prayers as the ship sank. The Chaplains had distributed life jackets to all except themselves.

Consequently, the four Chaplains becazme an enduring example of extraordinary faith, courage, and selflessness. These men are honored annually at the Post for their service to their country. The ceremony is open to the public. The service consists of a chaplain's prayer, a summary of the evnts that occurred on February, 1943, a short biography about each of the four Chaplains, followed by a 21-gun salute & "Taps" performed by the Post 90 Honor Guard. Thank you to everyone who helped out. It was a well attended event.

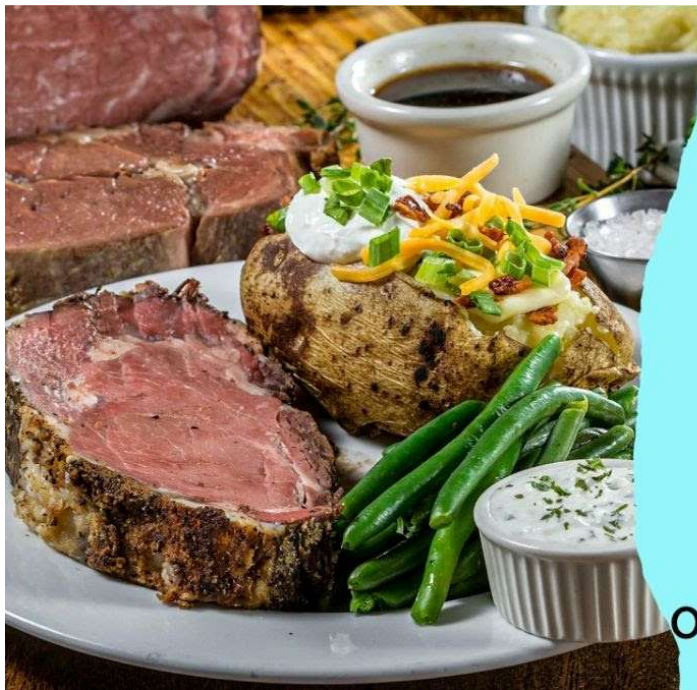
